Message from Ms Lampert

End of Term Transition

The government has realised that it is not possible, within the current restrictions to have all children back in school by the end of term. However, they have given the green light for schools to open to more pupils if safe to do so. We are currently nearly at capacity for pupils (there is some space in Nursery and Reception) but we feel that it would be right, given these changes to guidance, to welcome more children back before the end of term. Therefore, <u>school will be closed to pupils in Year 6, Year 1 and Nursery from Wednesday 15th July</u> so that on Thursday and Friday we can offer transition (Pod Picnics) to those pupils in Little Acorns N1, and Years 2, 3, 4 and 5, who have been home learning since March.

The purpose of the 'Pod Picnic' meetings is to allow children to see some of their friends from their class and their current teacher but to also meet their new teacher and ask any questions they may have about the new class. Children will have a morning or afternoon snack within their Bubble and play some (socially distanced) games. Additionally, children will be able to collect their books from the current year and their school report. We feel that this will help those, who have been away from school for so long, to feel reassured about what school is currently like (a lot of fun for those attending) and be prepared for September.

SCHOOL UNIFORM ONLINE ORDERING

Goodies - our school uniform provider is now trading again and I would urge parents and carers to be prompt in ordering so that uniform is ready for September. Should you wish to remind yourselves of the requirements, there is a dedicated page on the school website.

Orders placed before midnight on the 15th of the month will be delivered approximately the end of the month. Orders placed before midnight on the last day of the month will be delivered approximately the middle of the following month. Please allow up to 20 working days from cut off during the busy months of June - September.

Deliveries into school are free, however you do have the option to pay for home delivery at a cost of £6.50 PLEASE NOTE - Home delivery is not an express option. Any orders that are due for delivery into school while the schools are closed will be held in our warehouse until the school reopens.



School Dinners

As I'm sure you are aware, we currently do not know what challenges September will hold for us but we are trying to be as prepared as possible.

Writhlington Secondary School kitchens, who provide our school dinners, have supported us and the school community throughout the Coronavirus pandemic and they continue to be proactive in their thoughts for September. They are determined, if able, to resume the provision of hot dinners (these may be delivered in individual portion pots - if government guidelines and our risk assessment continues to limit the use of the hall).

We have been provided with updated menus and would ask that you look carefully at the three week menu option, discuss it with your child/children and complete the form below. The meal patterns will be updated on our system for the Autumn Term.

Due to the current situation all meal patterns have been wiped from our system in the office and therefore if you do not complete this form by Friday July 10th no meals will be ordered for your child for September.

Please remember that we provide children in reception, Years 1 and 2 with Universal Free School Meals so there is no cost to the parents or carers. Additionally, those in receipt of Free School Meals incur no cost for meals ordered. All other meals are £2.60.
