In the past we have given advice and warnings about ONLINE SAFETY and age-appropriate COMPUTER GAMES for your children.

In a similar vein, it seems a small number of children are re-enacting scenes from films they should not have seen. Again all professionals working with children, including our Police School Liaison Officer, Amanda Ware (PCSO), and the Safeguarding Team state that it is NOT acceptable for children to be playing games or watching films that are age-rated for older children or adults. Friday 13th, It & The Texas Chainsaw Massacre and other similar film are purposefully horrific and disturbing and therefore highly inappropriate for children - they should not have access to them.

We know that parents are as keen as we are to keep their children safe, and this is a safeguarding issue - we look forward to your support in this.

Health and Wellbeing Survey



At the end of last year, children from Year 4 and 6 took part in an on-line Health and Wellbeing survey organised through the Schools Health Education Unit (SHEU). The children answered a list of questions including; diet, travel to school, internet safety, wellbeing, physical activity and leisure time. We will use the findings in the report, alongside other information e.g. questionnaires/school council minutes to inform our next steps in school development.

The two areas that we will be focussing on, over the coming year, are:

- Being Sugar Smart
- Increasing the amount of children enjoying, and seeing the benefit of, physical activity

Of interest to parents and carers may be the relatively high number of children who responded that they found it hard to concentrate at school due to feeling tired on at least 3 days in the week before the survey. See below the NHS guidance for number of hours sleep recommended for each age group.
