A huge THANK YOU to all the pupils who responded to our **BIG school questionnaire**. We were delighted we got a 56% response rate, representing 66 of our children throughout the school.

They are so positive about so many elements of St Mary's!

- 95% said teachers expect me to work hard and do my best; I am encouraged to do things for myself and be independent
- 94% said I get homework every week; my family believes that doing well at school is important

Maths Week at St Mary's

It was great to see so many parents in school, being hands-on too.


Nursery children and parents had heaps of fun creating shape collage printing, number line dinosaurs and sorting teddy bears to name but a few activities.

Class 1 invited parents into class <u>every day</u> to enjoy many different learning activities, including Numicon painting, creating number bond rainbows and hunting for shapes.

Class 2 spent the week becoming entrepreneurs: children budgeted, shopped, weighed, measured and became café owners for the week, ensuring that they made a profit. It was lovely to see parents enjoying their visit to the café. Class 3 enjoyed learning mathematical concepts through Lego. It is amazing just how much children can learn through play. In addition, they created fantastic mathematical bubble art and designed and made board games.

The children from Class 4 couldn't agree on their favorite part of the week because they loved them all: from creating fraction people, to making letters out of shapes and computer programming shapes. Most agreed though that being outside, creating Andy Goldsworthy-inspired mathematical art, with parents, was fantastic fun.

Health Week

We are excited about having so many visitors in school this week to talk to the children about keeping themselves safe and healthy:

- Nurse Tracey will be visiting Classes 1, 2 and 3 to ensure children understand teeth hygiene, the importance of hand-washing and the difference between safe and unsafe medicines
 - June, our crossing-patrol, will be making an appearance during assembly to discuss road-safety
 - NSPCC will deliver an age-appropriate assembly and workshop to all children
 - Wandsdyke Play Association will begin a series of cooking sessions in the hall
 - Class 5 begin SRE (Sex and Relationship Education) sessions with Maria, our school nurse

In addition, throughout the week, all classes will be carrying out activities around 'Keeping safe'.



During assembly this week, the children were reminded about ESafety and how to stay safe on-line. The benefits and risks of the internet/playing games were discussed. Children also thought about HOW LONG they should play on computers/tablets etc. each day. Many children thought that time should be limited (some thought one hour a day was realistic). In addition, we discussed playing age-appropriate games or having access to social networking sites, and the reasons that some are restricted to older children/adults.
