Parent Pay

As you are aware through previous communications and letters, we are utilising Parent Pay from September to process our school dinners AND, in future, to arrange payments and permissions for School Trips. This change is in response to discussions with parents who rightly pointed out that ordering meals on a weekly pattern for a three weekly menu was difficult to manage. Furthermore, we are hopeful that in the long run this development will also save administration time for staff in the school office.

Parent Pay was chosen as it will provide a 'one-stop-shop' for a cashless office – in time. It is used by our local secondary schools so once again to support parents not having to navigate two systems, accounts can be joined for pupils at St Mary's and pupils in a local Secondary schools; allowing all payments to be seen and organised from one place.

I am VERY pleased to note that since the 'launch' last week over 30 families have signed up and made a personal account on Parent Pay. Thank you! Many parents have let me know that the process is simple and straightforward. However, if for any reason, you are struggling to activate the account (and it may be a hiccup on our system) please let the office know as we have parents on standby who have offered a 'distanced' trouble shooting session to help.

From September all meals will need to be ordered from Parent Pay. In order to give the kitchen accurate numbers for the following week (for ordering ingredients and preparing the meals) the cut off for ordering meals will be midnight on each Wednesday for the following week. Numbers will be sent to the kitchens early Thursday morning.

So for meals commencing Monday 6th September, please order by midnight on 1st September, 2021.

Meals can be adjusted up to 9:30am for any absent children so it will be crucially important to let us know each day if your child is away from school.



School meals during the Summer holidays

During the summer holidays the Local Authority, B&NES, will be issuing vouchers for supermarkets to those parents/carers of pupils entitled to FSM. An email has been sent to all eligible parents/carers along with the letter from B&NES giving further details so please make sure you check your inboxes.

End of Term arrangements

At the end of every 'big term' (Christmas, Easter and in the Summer) school traditionally finishes a little bit earlier for children. We would like the Year 6 to be able to say (a socially distanced) good-bye to the rest of the school and have therefore changed the time that they leave school allowing them to go first.
