

### <u>Holiday Sports Club – register of interest.</u>

We are exploring the possibility of becoming a host venue for a holiday sports club. The club would be managed by Sporting Sensations, a multi-sport coaching company delivering to primary aged children. The company is directed by Mr Pile who currently works at the school supporting PE provision in a number of classes.

At this stage we are asking parents to register their interest so we can establish if the club is feasible. We would require 20 children.

If it is to go ahead, the club would run Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> Aug, Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> Aug and Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> August at a cost of £17.50 per day or £35 for all three days. It is hoped that the club would then continue for future holidays.
