Apart from in exceptional circumstances, there is an expectation that all Year 4 children will know their times tables by the DFE Multiplication Check in June in Year 4. In a similar way to phonic understanding being a building block to reading and writing, tables are integral to learning in many areas of maths (fractions, division, multiplication calculations, shape) and as such emphasis is put on this key learning throughout St Mary's.

#### Attendance Expectations for Schools – A reminder

We are aware that a minority of parents are taking their children on holiday during term time. At St Mary's our aim is to prepare pupils for their future lives and careers. With this in mind, we ask parents to observe the school holidays as prescribed. We do appreciate that things have been tough with much disruption and we are all looking forward to a holiday. However, we are unable to authorise holidays during term-time. Given how much schooling many pupils have missed over the last year, it is more important than ever that any absence is limited to reasons of genuine illness or other circumstances of an **exceptional** nature. In those cases, a 'request for absence' should be forwarded to the Headteacher. As mentioned previously, to illustrate the reason we are having to turn down requests for holidays in term time, we enclose an except from a recent government bulletin to schools:

"School attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils and the usual rules on school attendance apply. This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, for poor attendance.

As restrictions begin to lift, we know some families may be looking to take holidays during term time. As usual, parents should plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid seeking permission to take their children out of school on holiday."
