COVID Updates

We are mindful of the difficulties for all having only one entrance to our school site. It is difficult to socially distance on the pavement and is made even more difficult with the narrow lane for cars.

Many parents use the field adjacent to the park to say good-bye to their children and wait at the end of the day and this helps in avoiding congestion on the path. We would suggest that, during the better weather, this would be a great solution for all.

To facilitate constant movement and avoid blocking the only entrance into the school after Easter we will welcome two year groups in at the same time (in phases) and arrange for children to line up inside the school gate in designated places or walk straight to their classes from drop off. Please arrive at your designated time or that of a sibling.

Teachers have been asked not to converse with parents blocking the entrance but are always available by email, phone, or Class Dojo/Tapestry.

Staggered drop off at the end of the day would be much easier if parents were to wait on the play park field, again avoiding congestion at the gate.

We are hopeful with more people being vaccinated, the decreasing number of COVID cases and the government roadmap continuing to be able to as soon as possible further decrease the necessity to stagger starts, limit ourselves to 'bubbles' and get back to a more normal way of working but currently we must maintain the good practices we have implemented.

EASTER BREAK OUT – BATH RUGBY

We are pleased to be delivering Easter Break Out on behalf of B&NES Council and the Department of Education (DOE) - a series of FREE fun-filled Easter holiday hubs for local vulnerable children and teenagers, supported by a consortia of other Charities and local businesses. The hubs will offer the provision of sport, food and recreational activities.

Hubs will operate Tuesday - Friday (w/c 4th & 11th April) at Southside Youth Hub in Bath, Castle Primary in Keynsham and Welton Rovers FC in Midsomer Norton.

Hub sessions will be available for children and teenagers from across B&NES, who are entitled to Free School Meals (Pupil Premium Plus). This limitation on participant numbers is due to current Covid-19 restrictions - the team are committed to supporting as many young people as permitted across the two-week period. INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/CARERS:

Test and Trace Support Payment: Parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their schools or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a [Test and Trace Support Payment](#) or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria. The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme is intended to ensure that parents receive the financial support they need if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities. Applications for the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme are made via the local authority in which the parent or carer resides, not the local authority where the setting is situated, if these are different.



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To be eligible applicants must meet all the criteria that:

- they are the parent or guardian of a child or young person in the same household and need to take time off work to care for them while they self-isolate. This is limited to one parent or guardian per household for the child or young person's self-isolation period.
- they are employed or self-employed.
- they cannot work from home while undertaking caring responsibilities and will lose income as a result.
- they meet all the other means-tested eligibility criteria for a Test and Trace Support Payment or locally determined criteria for a discretionary payment.

That their child:

- is aged 15 or under (or 25 or under with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC)) and normally attends an education or childcare setting.
- has been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or by their education or childcare setting because they have been identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19.
