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<u>Uniform</u>

Some parents have contacted the school to inform us that they are unhappy with the negativity generated in some groups by a small minority of individuals. I would suggest that if the groups are upsetting or not of a positive nature, you could perhaps leave the group. The parent Code of Conduct from The Partnership Trust and school is available from the school office and I would remind parents that 'Posting defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments about our schools, their staff or any member of their communities, on social media platforms' will not be tolerated.
