## Building project

#### Community:

As you may know, parents can now check their eligibility for 30 hours Early Years Education from September 2017. You need to check your own eligibility via the HMRC checker:

For any parents who are unable to access the internet, there is a help line available 0300 1234097

If you are eligible, you will be given a code which you will need to give to the school office, along with a NI number.

Bath & North East Somerset Council is warning residents about the dangers of **fidget spinners**, after its Trading Standards team seized nearly 300 spinners from shops and stalls in Bath.

They seized fidget spinners with small parts that can easily pop out, causing a choking hazard to young children. Some featured a blade with sharp pointed edges, and others had LED lights containing lithium-ion batteries which, if ingested, can cause internal bleeding.

In most cases, no safety warnings or minimum age restrictions were indicated on the fidget spinners. There were also no name and address details for the manufacturer/importer, which would enable the fidget spinners to be swiftly withdrawn from the market in the event of a product safety issue.

Councillor Martin Veal (Conservative, Bathavon North), Cabinet Member for Community Services, said: "Fidget spinners are new and currently very popular among young people. We want to ensure that when using these devices that young people are safe. Our Trading Standards Officers have been looking at some of the spinners on sale and found them to have very small and dangerous parts, so for public safety it's only right that they be withdrawn from sale. Anyone buying a fidget spinner should purchase it from a reputable trader and ensure the safety warnings can be clearly seen on the packaging."

Bath & North East Somerset Council's Trading Standards Officers are now working with the fidget spinner sellers to trace the supply chain and identify the importers so that the dangers to children identified can be addressed.

If you have concerns about a spinner you have bought, or a retailer selling them, contact the Citizen Advice Bureau on 03454 040506; if necessary, they will refer complaints to the relevant local authority if Trading Standards need to investigate.

If you are a parent/guardian whose child is currently in year 2 and due to move up to year 3 in September:

If you receive the eligible benefits for Free School Meals and are not currently registered for Free School Meals (EBB), you should register in time for September as your child will no longer be receiving the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM).

Eligible benefits are as follows:

- Income Support
- Income-Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (WITHOUT Working Tax Credit) and have and annual household income (as assessed by HMRC) below £16,190
- Working Tax Credit **Run-on** which is *only paid for 4 weeks* after you STOP qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- The Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under PartV1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- During the initial roll out of the benefit Universal Credit

Please ask at the office for a form if you think you could be eligible. This is not just about free lunches, but also Pupil Premium – an additional £1300 for additional resources for each child!
