ART: Colour Chaos



National Curriculum outcomes:

Key Vocabulary:

Spelling	Definition/Sentence
primary	a set of colours that can be combined to make a gamut of colours
colour mixing	creating a new colour by combining other colours
secondary	a colour resulting from the mixing of two primary colours
tertiary	a colour that is a result of mixing and equal amount of a primary and secondary colour
tints	a shade or variety of a colour
shades	a slight degree of difference between colours.
collage	a piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.
colour-field	is characterized primarily by large fields of flat, solid colour spread across or stained into the canvas creating areas of unbroken surface and a flat picture plane.
drip painting	is a form of abstract art in which paint is dripped or poured on to the canvas.
warm colours	is used to describe any colour that is vivid or bold in nature.
cool colours	is used to describe any colour that is calm or soothing in nature
