RE: Why are some places special?



National Curriculum Knowledge outcomes: Key RE questions:

- (a) What places are special to me? Why are they special?
- (b) What places are special to members of a religious or belief community?(Buildings used for worship, special places in the home)
- (c) What do the buildings that are special to religious or belief communities look like?
 - Do they have special places, objects, pictures or symbols?
 - How are these used?
 - What do they tell us about what people believe?
