Pupils should be taught about:


- Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally
- To develop an awareness of the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. Some should be used to compare aspects of life in different periods.

Wider Curriculum:

Research a Famous Explorer: children are asked to present information that they've found out about an explorer of their choice, in a format of their choosing. They could explore whether there are any explorers that may have originated from the local area.

Learning Journey:

- When did Christopher Columbus live and what was he trying to achieve?
- What was Christopher Columbus's journey like and what did he discover?
- What was the impact of Columbus's voyages and what did he bring back to Europe?
- Who is Neil Armstrong and why he is remembered today?
- What can I find out about Neil Armstrong's landing on the moon and the impact this had on the world?
- Can I compare the lives and achievements of Columbus and Armstrong?
