Topic: Printing Artist: Hokusai

Can I respond to an artist's work?

Exploring artwork by Hokusai - looking at 36 views of Mount Fuji.

Can I explore printing techniques? Experimenting with different print styles (over several lessons)

Pupils to use their experience of printing and their research of Hokusai to create their own image in his style.

Key Vocabulary:

Spelling	Definition/Sentence
Etching	When an image is cut on to the surface and then pressed on to ink to make a replica.
Intaglio	When an image is cut in to a surface and ink is placed on top then wiped away leaving it just in the lines made.
Collograph	Where textures and materials are added to a printing place to leave an image.
Lino print	When a design is cut in to the lino surface and then pressed on to paper.
Hokusai	A Japanese print artist who lived from 1760 until 1849 and is well known for his prints of Mount Fuji.
