Art - Commotion in the Ocean



Knowledge Outcomes:

During Year 2 pupils should be taught:

- to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

Oracy:

Lesson 1: Children use description and evaluation sentence stems to describe their observations of Turner's paintings, similarities and differences and their likes and dislikes.

Lesson 6: Children use evaluation stem sentences to evaluate their own work.

Prior Learning:

Children will have described the work of the artist, Lowry and created a city collage.

Learning Journey:

- Create a stormy sea picture, using paintings by J.M.W Turner as inspiration.
- To use a range of techniques (including using salt, blotting and colour mixing) to give texture and dynamism to watercolour work.
- Create a collage from paper strips and other imagery, using scissors to carefully cut around elements within the collage.
- Create collaged images of Atlantic sea creatures to explore the idea of camouflage and adaptation; understand the role of patterning in camouflage.
- Create an undersea display using a range of techniques.

Wider Curriculum:

The children will have the opportunity to gather ideas and knowledge from a visit to Bristol Aquarium. They will use what they have learnt to inform their art work in terms of colour, pattern, texture, shape, form and space.
