PTA Meeting

Thank you to those parents who attended the PTA meeting this week. Areas discussed fall broadly into three categories:

- What the PTA should fund that will benefit all of the children at St Mary's
 How to increase the funds in the PTA 'pot'
 - Additional projects parents could help, or get involved, with
 - Obviously the presence of COVID impacts on all of these.

On November 5th or 6th all the children will attend a 'Forest School' session at the fire pit; toasting marshmallows and carrying out activities outside to coordinate with Bonfire Night.

- Film Night: All the children will be invited to a Bubble Film Night, with Party Bag snacks, on November 18^{th} . £2.50 per child. Save the date more information to follow
- In December, the PTA are looking at recreating, where possible, some elements of the Christmas Fayre: this includes the children selling their home made gifts and, if possible, a visit from someone very special to ALL children. This will be discussed further at the next PTA meeting.
 - There are several projects currently 'on the go'. If you are able, or know of someone with specific expertise in any of these areas, all help is very, very welcome.
- The PTA shed has been bought, built and is currently being painted. Should anyone have an hour or two to complete this and begin weather-proofing the play shed (which houses all of our bikes and trikes) please let the school office know.

The willow tunnel will be tamed and cut back to bring it under control. The PTA have sourced help with this.



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The PTA are currently investigating whether it is possible to plant a hedge at the back of the school using websites such as The Woodland Trust, the BBC Promise campaign etc. to increase habitat areas for wildlife, for children to be involved in planting a legacy for the school and to reinforce the boundary of the field. Again if anyone has particular expertise in the field do contact the school office. Lastly, Miss Lampert has asked for help to get the allotment productive. This would involve digging, preparing and planting. Volunteers needed.

Should you wish to be involved there is also a 'whatsapp' group: Please let the school office know and we can pass on your details. The PTA will consider timings of the meetings so that all parents are able to attend, there has been a question over whether these could at times be held in the evenings.
