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ONLINE SAFETY/COMPUTER GAMES

A lot of children had new devices/technologies for Christmas and are enjoying playing a range of new games on them. There are some amazing apps, games and social media opportunities that our children are benefitting from.

However, the message from all professionals working with children, including our Police School Liaison Officer, Amanda Ware (PCSO), and the Safeguarding Team is that it is NOT acceptable for children to be playing games that are age-rated for older children or adults. Nor should they have Facebook accounts or interact on sites or media or messaging sites like WhatsApp - they are not intended for children.

Research shows that allowing children to play these types of games on Xboxes and Playstations is neglectful as children may be more vulnerable to grooming and abuse by being exposed to early sexualised behaviour, as well as extreme brutality such as is often seen in video games in the upper age classifications.

Call of Duty, Grand Theft Auto, Dogs of War, Five Nights at Freddy's and other similar games are all inappropriate for children and they should not have access to them.

Children, as part of our Computing curriculum, learn how to keep themselves safe but if you would like to talk to someone about your child's online or digital safety please contact the school: we are here to help.

We know that parents are as keen as we are to keep their children safe and we look forward to your support in this issue.

A Reminder

In order to keep EVERYONE safe, please remind your child/children not to race bikes OR scooters around the school before or after school where younger, vulnerable children, or even parents, may get hurt.
