Chocolate Chip Cookies

(Gluten, Dairy & Refined Sugar Free)

Ingredients;

1 cup chickpea flour

1/3 cup cacao flour

3/4 tsp bicarb of soda

1 large egg

1/2 cup melted coconut oil

2 tsp vanilla extract

Dark chocolate chips (df)

Method;

175degC - GM 4/5

Combine flour, cacao powder and bicarb.

In a separate bowl mix egg, oil, sugar and vanilla.

Whisk each bowl of ingredients.

Mix dry ingredients into wet, slowly (pull together with metal spoon).

Add choc chips.

Roll to wanted size and place on baking tray.

Bake for 8 mins.
