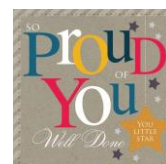

Please ensure you continue to stay away from school if you have any symptoms of COVID and test regularly so that we can minimize large scale disruptions e.g. class closure and staffing shortages.

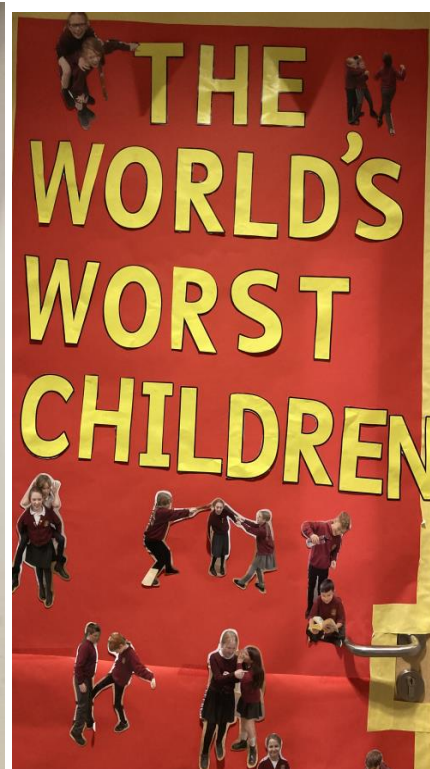
