Knowledge Outcomes (Geography):

During Year 2 pupils should be taught to:

Locational knowledge

name and locate the world's seven continents

Place knowledge

 understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country (Brazil)

Human and physical geography

- identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator (Cocoa growing countries)
- use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to:
- key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather
- key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop

Geographical skills and fieldwork

 use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage. (Locate cocoa-growing countries)

Learning Journey:

- How and when were cocoa beans first used?
- How has the production of chocolate developed over time?
- Where does cocoa come from?
- What is the journey from bean to bar?
- Where is Brazil?
- What are the features of cities in Brazil?
- How is the weather in Brazil different to the UK?

Wider Curriculum:

Children will be reading and learning through the book 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' by Roald Dahl as part of book term. They will be designing and making chocolate bars and packaging in DT.
