

Design & Technology – Fabric Bunting



Knowledge Outcomes:

Pupils should be taught to:

Key Vocabulary

Spelling	Definition / Sentence
bunting	Rows of small coloured flags that are used to decorate streets and buildings on special occasions.
fabric	Cloth or other material produced by weaving together cotton, nylon, wool, silk, or other threads.
evaluate	Consider something in order to make a judgment about it, for example about how good or bad it is
product	Something that is produced and sold in large quantities, often as a result of a manufacturing process.
design	When someone designs a garment, building, machine, or other object, they plan it and make a detailed drawing of it from which it can be built or made.
textile	Textiles are types of cloth or fabric, especially ones that have been woven.
stitch	If you stitch cloth, you use a needle and thread to join two pieces together or to make a decoration.
material	Material is cloth.
template	A thin piece of metal or plastic which is cut into a particular shape. It is used to help you cut wood, paper, metal, or other materials accurately, or to reproduce the same shape many times.
join	To join two things means to fix or fasten them together.
